International Cooperation and Humanitarian Support Internship

In order to support Caritas Europa's international cooperation and humanitarian work, the Secretariat based in Brussels is offering a full-time, 5-months internship through the <u>European Leadership Programme</u> fellowship of Jesuit European Social Centre (JESC).

Mission

The intern's main activities will relate to the support of the international cooperation and humanitarian (ICH) unit with collecting and analysing information on the humanitarian and development impact of Caritas Europa member organisations, support in organising events and advocacy activities, and assist in drafting monthly newsletters for Caritas Europa member organisations.

The intern will be part of the international cooperation and humanitarian unit and will report to the Unit Director.

Key tasks

The intern will:

- Collect and analyse information on the humanitarian/development impact of Caritas Europa member organisations;
- Assist with drafting international cooperation and humanitarian newsletters;
- · Support in event planning and other advocacy activities;
- Support in reviewing the Multi-Annual Indicative Programme materials of DG INTPA;
- Analyse and report on ECHO funding trends of Caritas agencies and map the ECHO-funded work of Caritas;
- Monitor European Parliament hearings;
- Update the list of contacts of attachés in the Permanent Representations;
- Support the unit in any other work that is part of the work plan as needed;
- Support the CE-Secretariat in any activities as needed:
- Participate in unit and team meetings.

- Fluent in spoken and written English, preferably with good command of other European language(s). The working language is English;
- Basic knowledge of, and commitment to, the Catholic Social Teachings (CST), including its key principles

- Self-motivated, helpful and dedicated team player, able to take responsibility and initiative;

- Good IT and computer skills.
